Luzula Nivea Snow Wood Rush
Originating from the Alps, this is a lovely, ornamental, evergreen rush bearing clusters of white, spiky flowers on arching stems in early summer.

- Hardy Perennial
- Flowers: Early summer
- Height: 45-60cm
- Position: Semi-shade

Common Name: Snowy woodrush
Genus: *Luzula* This spreading evergreen perennial has clumps of grass-like deep green basal leaves. Tiny, brilliant white flowers borne in tight clusters appear in early summer and midsummer.
Noteworthy characteristics: Native to western and central Europe. Thrives in regions with wet winters and dry summers. Flowers can be dried.
Care: Grow in poor to moderately fertile, humus-rich, moist but well-drained soil. Prefers full sun.
Propagation: Divide between mid-spring and early summer.
Pest and Diseases: Rust and Septoria leaf spot

This grass-like, evergreen perennial produces masses of white flowers from early to mid-summer. These blooms may be dried for long-lasting indoor displays. The plants are slow spreading and form loose clumps of flat, dark green leaves. An excellent ornamental grass that makes a good groundcover in shady areas. Unlike other luzulas, this species can tolerate full sun although it needs moist soil.
